The Dean of Instruction and the faculty member involved first conduct the investigation and work to resolve the situation. However, if punitive action is required the situation is turned over to the Vice President for Administration.

We're still working that out. I am currently the VP designated to convene the appeals committee (I think because I am the VP that works with the faculty Academic Standards Committee). My feeling is that academic issues such as grade changes should remain within Academic Affairs.

The Dean of Students here is currently the primary administrator with responsibility for the Academic Honor Code (as part of the Student Code of Conduct) but it is becoming a bit overwhelming. We will be having discussions with our academic colleagues about how to make this more manageable. In our system I typically hear appeals of decisions whether they are a result of academic misconduct or other violations of the Code.
