Institution	Formal Early Admissions Process?	Notes:
Kishwaukee Community College	No	<p>“High school students under age 16 may be considered for enrollment in credit classes with the joint approval of the high school principal and the Director of Admissions, Registration, and Records at Kishwaukee College.”</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Largest group = home schooled under age of 16 • Decision depends on course desired and ability • Math – likely placed; Physical Education – probably not
McHenry Community College	Yes	<p>Two groups: 14 and above; 13 and below</p> <p>Process:</p> <p>Step 1. Meet with school counselor and complete “running Start Enrollment and Registration form. If planning to take Reading, English or Math, must meet pre-req, and college placement tests or have appropriate ACT scores.</p> <p>Step 2. Students age 15 and below – obtain instructor signature Students age 13 and below – Parent and student meet with instructor first, then Ex. Dean for class approval and signature on the Running Start Enrollment form.</p> <p>These processes must be completed each semester to take courses at MCC.</p>
Kankakee Community College	Yes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Early admits must at least be eligible for high school • 16+ years of age must have written permission from parent and HS counselor • Below 16 must also meet with Dean; decision is made by Dean • Students take COMPASS or submit ACT scores for placement • Usually restricted to one or two courses only

Oakton Community College	Yes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Require student to be a junior or senior in high school • Minimum GPA of 2.0 • Approval from parent and HS counselor • Limit student to one course per semester • Exceptions are made on individual case basis • Youngest student is 11 years old
Moraine Valley Community College	Not formal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Require students under 16 to meet with Dean and sometimes with instructor • Written recommendation from HS counselor • Meet with student and parent; require signature on “statement of understanding”
Rock Valley College	Yes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Require students under 16 to meet with “HS Connections Transition Advisor” • Written permission from principal or HS counselor is required • 2 to 3 letters of recommendation required • Completion of Accuplacer or ACT scores that place the student into college level courses (remedial course placement is not considered) • RVC instructor permission required
